We are a Nut Aware School - Anaphylaxis - Reminder

We have a number of children who have been diagnosed with Anaphylaxis. This means they have a severe allergic reaction to all types of nuts. If these children are exposed to any of these products their condition can be life threatening.

Please help us to keep all our students safe by ensuring your child does not bring food containing any nuts to school. Your support helps to minimise the risk to them.

Equipment / Book Packs

Safety tips for drivers using a Drop-off and Pick-up zones (Kiss and Drop)

- •Always drop off or pick up your child from the designated zone and follow the school's procedures.
- •Drivers should remain in their vehicles at all times in the Drop-off and Pick-up zone.
- •Make sure children use the Safety Door (the rear footpath side door) to get in and out of the car.
- •Make sure the handbrake is applied when the vehicle is stationery.
- ·Always park legally.
- •Avoid dangerous manoeuvers such as U-turns and three-point turns.

Student Welfare and Expectations

These environments have high expectations, embed school wide expectations within the curriculum and are implemented with consistency and fidelity across all learning environments and by all staff.

Everyone associated with Werrington County Public School has the right to the highest standards of educational endeavour in a safe, secure and respectful environment.

When parents enrol their children at our school, they enter into a partnership with the school staff. This partnership is based on shared responsibility and mutual respect.

SRL Awards

Safe, Respectful, Learner (SRL) Awards are given out by classroom teachers and RFF teachers at COLA assembly Friday afternoon. Students must receive 1 Safe, 1 Respectful and 1 Learner award before being nominated to move to the next level of the behaviour system.

Student need to achieve **3 SRL awards** and be nominated to move to the next level prior to receiving their Bronze, Silver and Gold Award.

Year 5 students need to achieve their Gold Award (nominated) by Week 4, Term 4 to be eligible for a Student Leadership Position.

The actual Bronze Silver and Gold Award are handed out on the respective Privilege Days.

Other Awards

Super Superkid Awards are awarded to 2 students per class at the K-6 assembly at the end of Terms 1, 2 and 3. These are at the discretion of the class teacher, however these students should consistently exemplify the school's values of a Safe, Respectful Learner. Students are eligible to receive the **Principal's Medallion** once they have received 3 Super Superkid Awards, and have attained their gold awards every year, across their Werrington County Public School life. These awards **do not** count towards Bronze Silver Gold Awards.

Class Merit Awards are handed out at K-2, 3-6 and K-6 assemblies. These can be for targeted achievements both social and academic. These awards **do not** count towards Bronze Silver Gold Awards or Principal's medallion.

Sport News

K-2 Sport Day is Tuesday from 9-10am. Grades 3-6 Sport Day is Friday.

Library News

Thank you to the families who returned library books that were found over the holidays or paid for books that have become lost. There are still a few students with outstanding library books and they will receive orange coloured notices shortly. A copy of our 'Procedures for dealing with overdue library books' is included with this newsletter.



Please remember to keep your books in a safe place. Books that become lost or damaged beyond repair will need to be paid for.

If a book has become damaged, please don't repair it. Just include a note advising me that the book needs repairing and I will attend to it.

<u>Procedures for Dealing with Overdue Library Books</u>

Weekly

Using OLIVER, the Teacher Librarian reminds students during library class time to return any overdue library books. Once a student has an overdue library book they are not permitted to borrow any further books until the overdue ones have been returned or the replacement costs paid for.

<u>Monthly</u>

At the beginning of each month a computer generated (OLIVER) reminder notice is sent to all students who have not returned library books. For those students who have already been issued with an OLIVER generated reminder letter, a letter signed by the teacher librarian and the principal will be sent to the student's home via the post. Weekly class reminders continue.

At the end of the year a record is kept of all students and the titles of the resources that they have not returned. Students who have failed to return library books or pay for their replacement cost will be prevented from borrowing to take home. This will not however prevent them from using any library resources whilst they are at school, nor prevent them from accessing the library at the appropriate times.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2020

This year our school has once again decided to register for the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge. The challenge is a special initiative to foster a love of literature and to encourage children to read widely for leisure and pleasure.

The challenge for students in **K-2** is to experience 30 books from the K-2 Premier's Reading Challenge booklists by mid August 2020. You are able to read these books to your child or the student can read themselves. 25 of the books must come from the PRC list. The remaining 5 are free choice.

All students who successfully complete the challenge will receive a signed certificate from the NSW Premier. Our school library has many of the books on the booklists already in the library for the students to borrow. You may also read PRC books that you have at home or borrow from the local library.

For students in K-2 who participate at home, I will also be issuing my own incentive certificates once a student has read 10, 20, & 30 books.

Students in Years 3-6 will be completing the PRC as part of their wide reading in class and keep their reading record in the library.

Please note: Students no longer need a permission note to participate in the PRC however if for any reason you do not wish your child to participate please advise the school. The permission note below is for students K-2 who are completing the Reading Challenge at <u>home.</u>
