School Contributions \$50 per child \$100 per family Our first 8 weeks of school have been a fabulous start to the year. Students have settled into routines, are undertaking new learning challenges and have worked together to develop the expectations for learning within their classrooms. Last week we had a visit from Cathy Brennan (Executive Director, School Performance – Metropolitan North), Craig Redfern (Director Educational Leadership – Cambridge Park Network) and Katrina Berwick (Principal - Cambridge Park Public School) to see the fabulous learning taking place within our school. WCPS School Captains Marley and Sienna, led our visitors on a school tour to share what they are proud of at our school. Congratulations to them both for hosting the visit with confidence and pride and sharing our school with educational leaders.

This past fortnight we have been excited by the news that we could again open our gates for drop off and pick up, however there are some continued restrictions regarding COVID -19 safe practice.

COVID Guidelines

Parents and carers are able to enter school grounds but should continue to follow COVID-19 safe practices, including physical distancing between adults of 1.5 metres.

Morning Drop Off

- Students will continue to be greeted at the gate by a member of the executive staff.
- Parents are able to enter the courtyard to drop students off, however we ask that you kiss and drop without waiting with your child until the bell.

Afternoon Pick Up

- Parents are able to enter the courtyard after 2:50pm to wait for their child.
- Please be seated on the silver seats in the courtyard and wait away from classroom doorways and walkways to enable students and teachers to exit classrooms with physical distance.
- Students will exit with parents and carers via the COLA gate at 3pm.
- Support Unit students and siblings will exit via the main gate at the administration office.
- Stage 3 students without siblings will continue to exit via the gate at the southern end of the office block.

Teacher Meetings

Due to our continued guidelines, teachers are unable to meet with you at length to discuss your child's learning during pick up or drop off.

If you would like to discuss your child's learning with his/her teacher, please schedule an appointment through the office by phone or email. The teacher will then arrange a time that is suitable to meet with you, either face to face or via phone.

Road Safety

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools. Please help us to look after the safety of all of our students by remembering the following:

- drop off and pick up children on the school side of the road
- never call out to children from across the road it is very dangerous
- always take extra care when driving in 40km school zones
- follow all parking signs these help keep children as safe as possible
- park responsibly even if this means you have to walk further to the school gate
- never double park it is illegal and puts children at risk
- never do a U-turn or three-point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours to your children.

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PRC FAQ's

I have some books at home that might be on the PRC list. How do I find out?

The official PRC booklists can be found at: <u>https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/booklist/home.html</u> or you can use the search box that can be found on the top right hand side of the page.

Can I include books from home and/or the ones that I may borrow from the local library?

Of course! Simply use the search box to locate the ID number and record them on your child's PRC card.

My child is in Years3-6 and does not bring their PRC card home. What do they do to record books read at home and/or the library?

Simply note the title and the ID number on a piece of paper so that your child can record it on their card at school.

Can my child read more than 1 book from a series?

For an approved PRC series, students can read **any two titles** which will count as official PRC books in their reading records. **Other titles** read from the same series will show as Personal choice books. The limit on series books encourages students to read a variety of genres and authors, rather than reading books from a few series or by the same author.
