2022 Classes

Students will move into their new 2022 classes on Monday 7 February. Our teachers have worked very hard to consider both the academic and social needs of all of our students and have spent many hours forming new classes to ensure we are meeting the needs of all students. We would like to thank you for your patience this week whilst we finalise the number of students we will have at Werrington County PS and plan our classes accordingly.

This year our class organisation has changed to a stage-based model. This means that classes will have more than one grade in each class. Stage based classes are formed for a range of reasons including academic, social and organisational needs. Our syllabus documents are organised into four stages in primary school and using a stage-based model for classes allows our teachers to differentiate and cater for a range of needs within the class. Year groups are broken down into stages as follows:



Grouping students by stage does not change the year group they are in nor does it impact on what they are learning, students academic needs will be catered to based on their current needs. A huge thank you to our families who collected the Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) last Friday and Monday. We hope that you are finding the surveillance testing helpful and reassuring when sending your children to school. I would also like thank our families who have been keeping their children home from school if they are displaying symptoms of COVID-19 and have tested negative. Please keep us updated if you are keeping your children home if they are unwell, you can do this by email or phone. Our second delivery of RATs arrived this week and we will communicate how these will be send home after receiving advice from the Department of Education.
